### Definitions/Explanations of Terms Above

- Vocabulary = Sheet given to you re: trial/courtroom vocabulary
- Character Sketch = Sheet given to you; detailed description of who your character is; used to develop ideas re: case line/trial structure
- Case Line/Trial Structure = 1 paragraph overall argument; order you will call your witnesses; brief description of purpose of each witness (in context of larger argument)
- Direct ?s = 4-8 questions your attorneys will ask you; should be in line with case line/trial structure
- Cross Examination ?s = How you will disprove, discredit, prove guilt/innocence through testimony of other side's witnesses
- Cross Examination Plan = Plans on your characters flaws; brainstorm of how they will attack you and how you will defend yourself
- Opening/Closing = Opening argument/closing arguments; more information to come on how to develop these
- Research Folder = Source list (does not need to be a formal bibliography) with **\*\*brief annotation\*\*** on purpose of the source; include a screenshot or first page of source
